To Whom It May Concern:

On October 24, 2005, Hurricane Wilma slammed into South Florida with strength of Category 2-3 winds crossing over Palm Beach County, Florida. It was immediately estimated to have caused approximately 3 million yards of debris in Palm Beach County alone.

Within a couple of days after the disaster, the Solid Waste Authority (SWA) of Palm Beach County contacted Sunburst Sanitation. The SWA wanted to activate a preexisting contract with Sunburst Sanitation for disaster debris removal. The SWA asked Sunburst Sanitation to please handle all debris removal within 3 districts it had partitioned out.

Sunburst Sanitation, not having the means to handle this large amount of debris removal immediately contracted Bamaco, Inc. (Bamaco) to take on the challenge. Bamaco took on the challenge from beginning to end, with a tremendous amount of professionalism. This project was a "Turn Key" operation for Sunburst Sanitation.

Bamaco immediately came into position within a couple of days after being contracted. Supervisors were assigned to portioned areas within the districts, along with the appropriate equipment and personnel to complete the job. Bamaco brought on many different subcontractors to assist them and they did a heck of a good job managing all of them. The logistics alone, with dealing with so many different contractors was impressive. Especially important, was how Bamaco ensured, even at the end of the project, as volumes significantly declined, that all the necessary equipment stayed in the county until the job was complete.

Many different residential communities, including Palm Beach County expressed their appreciation and gratitude for a job well done. The county had been cleaned up in record time, especially compared to the 2004 hurricane cleanup that was very similar in scope.
